





CDMX CULTURAL MAP










Soccer is a Celebration

A binational educational exhibition celebrating the cultural, economic, and social impact of soccer. Developed in partnership with the Perot Museum in Dallas, the showcase explores three key pillars: the social dimension, the economy, and well-being, through interactive experiences, guided activities, sports clinics, and special presentations.







UNIVERSUM

Science on the Pitch

An exhibition revealing the scientific principles behind soccer. The showcase explores topics such as ball physics, biomechanics, artificial intelligence, and technology applied to the game, offering an interactive experience that merges science and innovation.


















MUSEO PAPALOTE

Touch, Play, and Learn

A space where children "touch, play, and learn" across thematic sections. Following the museum's philosophy, the program invites visitors to experience soccer through interactive games and workshops in a family-friendly environment, approaching the sport as a vehicle for learning and fun.



LEONORA CARRINGTON

Labyrinth

A multimedia experience guiding visitors through a surrealist labyrinth, the core of Leonora Carrington's poetics. The narrative highlights the search for freedom, myth, and imagination, weaving together symbols and creatures from her universe. This monumental installation immerses the audience, organizing the journey to uncover recurrent themes and creative stages, offering a deep insight into one of surrealism's essential voices.

Date: March to August 2026.

COLLECTION:

Features 14 monumental sculptures (4 meters high), archival photographs, lithographs, and jewelry selected by the Leonora Carrington Council.

EL COLEGIO NACIONAL

What Color is Green?

An exhibition centered on the Mexican National Team, designed to explore the intersection of literature and national identity. Writer Juan Villoro presents a narrative of key events in the collective memory—such as decisive goals—analyzing moments that have acquired deep symbolic significance.





Uneven Fields



An installation transforming a soccer field to reflect social inequalities. Featuring sloped and fragmented terrain, the piece confronts visitors with the invisible barriers that condition both the game and life. The project is inspired by the work of Priscilla Monge.

Date: June to August 2026.













MUSEO NACIONAL DE ANTROPOLOGÍA E HISTORIA

Annie Leibovitz & Soccer

A photographic exhibition connecting Mexico's past and present within the framework of the FIFA World Cup™. Featuring the participation of Annie Leibovitz, the showcase will be displayed at the National Museum of Anthropology.

Date: June to August 2026.

SCACER GIANTS

A series of 23 monumental figures ranging from 6 to 8 meters in height. Crafted by master cartoneros (traditional papier-mâché artisans) from Iztapalapa, these sculptures are installed at key points across Mexico City. The urban intervention merges traditional Mexican craftsmanship with the culture of the sport.





EVENTS AND EXPERIENCES HOST CITY



Cultivating the Future Through Sport

A tournament designed to promote inclusion, equity, and a culture of peace. It functions as a platform for social transformation, using soccer to establish a legacy of equality for children and adolescents in Mexico City within the framework of the 2026 tournament.

Date: November 2025 to February 2026.

PARTICIPATION:

Open to children and adolescents aged 9 to 16 in female, male, and mixed categories.

FORMAT & STRUCTURE:

- **Stages:** Two phases: Intramural and Borough-level (Alcaldías), with direct elimination starting from the round of 16.
- **Teams:** Squads of up to 10 players (7 vs 7 matches), consisting of two 20-minute halves.
- **Fair Play:** Includes a special "Big Heart" recognition system to encourage sportsmanship.
- Organization: A collaborative effort between the Government of Mexico City, FIFA™ Mexico, Host City, and FEMEXFUT.





An exclusive tournament organized in collaboration with Liga MX. The event gathers legends and distinguished guests for a competition that combines sport and social interaction in a premium setting.

EVENT COMPONENTS:

- Welcome: Reception and distribution of personalized player kits.
- Course Experience: Visual integration throughout the circuit (Tees, Greens, Flags, and Carts).
- Hospitality: Gourmet catering services provided on the course and during the closing reception.
- Awards: Presentation of the commemorative trophy and closing ceremony.

VENUE: BOSQUE REAL COUNTRY CLUB.



Format: 36 players | Pairs format | 18 holes | 2 days.

A Multisensory Pavilion. A pavilion celebrating the greatness of Mexico across seven thematic rooms. The journey bridges the past and present, blending popular traditions with sophistication under an iconic "X" that serves as the emblem and meeting point.

- **NATIONAL PAVILIONS:** 48 design modules featuring cultural exhibitions and merchandise from participating countries.
- **ACTIVATIONS:** An artistic program on the main stage, featuring thematic exhibitions and designated social areas.





FIFAFAN FESTIVAL

The Latin American Epicenter of the Celebration

The festival transforms the country's most iconic public square into a global hub for fans. Serving as the primary meeting point throughout the 39-day tournament, the venue features live match broadcasts on a monumental screen (55x18m), alongside a program of live concerts, DJs, and a curated gastronomic and cultural offering.

Date: June and July 2026

KEY POINTS:

- **VENUE:** Zócalo, Mexico City.
- ACCESS: Free admission for up to 100,000 daily visitors.
- **LIVE ZONE:** Screening of all matches on a monumental screen (55x18m) and main stage for concerts.
- **ACTIVATIONS:** Includes a Game Zone, partner activations, FIFA Store, and a gastronomic area (Food & Soul).
